SCHOLARSHIP FOR MASTERS SOCIAL SCIENCE

The Child Health and Development Centre of the College of Health Sciences, Makerere University, in collaboration with the University of Copenhagen in Denmark, received a grant from the Danish Ministry of Foreign Affairs to strengthen research capacity in Uganda. The project Quality Medicine Use for Children in Uganda is a 5- year multi-disciplinary collaboration that is devoted to improving the quality of medicine use and management for children in Uganda through research and research training. Within the collaboration, there is one scholarship for Masters Degree in social sciences.

Applications are invited for the academic year 2011/2012 from suitably qualified Ugandans for this scholarship at Makerere University that will focus on social aspects of medicine use in children with epilepsy. This will be a fully sponsored scholarship covering tuition and research costs. Eligible candidates must have a Bachelors Degree in any of the following: -

- a) Social Sciences- Sociology and Social Work and Social Administration
- b) Health Sciences- Medicine, Nursing, Pharmacy and Dentistry
- c) Adult and Community Education
- d) Education- Science with Education or Arts with Education

Applicants should be currently working, with at least 2 years of relevant experience in health services or health research institution.

Application Procedures:

Enrolment in a relevant Masters training program at Makerere University must be for the academic year 2011/2012. Candidates must submit their written application together with: -

- a) An up-to- date curriculum vitae
- b) Copies of relevant academic certificates
- c) Undergraduate University transcript
- d) Two-page statement of purpose of study and proposed research
- e) Two letters of reference- academic and professional
