MASTER OF ARTS IN ECONOMICS (MECO)

Objectives

The Master of Arts programme in Economics is designed to enable students to develop competence in the areas of economic analysis, research and to prepare them for a wide variety of positions as Economists and other related occupations in the Public and Private sectors.

Duration

The Programme of study leading to the MA. in Economics, is two (2) academic years. Students will be required to take four course units in each of the first three semesters and a dissertation for plan A in the last Semester. Those for plan B are required to take a two courses and a research project in the last semester.
