- iv) Involving family members and significantly others in the therapeutic process with the agreement of the client when such interactions are appropriate and conducive to client growth and development.
- d) The attitudes, ethics, and values requisite for a clinical psychologist.
- e) The knowledge and training to facilitate the development of clinical awareness and skills among colleagues and other professionals,
- f) The training and experience in self-evaluation and need for continuous knowledge development to enable life-long professional development.

The structure of the programme provides the integrative training of general clinical psychologists, with beginning expertise in some area of intervention. This expertise will come from ones practicum experience, supervision, and concentration. Areas of specialization include adult psychopathology, individual and group psychotherapy, child/family psychopathology and treatment, community psychology and prevention.

Programme Structure

The programme is 24 months of full-time study. In Year I lectures, independent inquiry, and practicals will comprise the first two semesters. Year II will be dedicated to advanced courses in the programme, practicals and the completion of a dissertation.

MASTER OF ARTS IN COUNSELLING (MACO)

Objectives

This programme of study is intended for honours graduates who are presently involved in counseling and the helping professions, as well as new graduates who have the proven maturity and people skills requisite for entry into the counseling profession. The programme is designed to provide opportunities for participants to acquire:

- a) Theoretical bases for psychotherapy

and the relationship between values and theory development

- b) Understanding of human function and dysfunction within society.
- c) Practical skills necessary for professional efficacy which include:
 - 1) Creating an empathic environment to facilitate the counselee's hope for positive personal change.

- 2) Initiating therapeutic interaction between the counselee and counselor
 - 3) Developing the counselee's coping skills and ability to maintain positive relationships within society.
 - 4) Liaising with family members and friends of clients to help the client set realistic life goals.
- d) Positive attitudes requisite for a counseling professional.
- e) Ability to facilitate the development of appropriate helping skills among non-counseling colleagues and other professionals within institutions and organizations.
- f) Increased sensitivity to the unique problems encountered by individuals due to gender, ethnic, or socio-economic differences.
- g) Commitment to personal integrity and devotion to the ethics of the counseling profession, training in self-evaluation and continuous knowledge acquisition to enable life-professional development.

Specific Admission Requirements

Programme candidates must hold a second class or higher honours degree. In addition, candidates must qualify under one of the two options below:

Option 1: Candidates must have documentation of two or more years of experience in counseling or an allied field. Among others, these include practicing social workers, lawyers working with advocacy organizations such as FIDA; hall wardens; school counselors and careers teachers; religious workers such as priests, sheiks, mullahs, pastors, nuns and brothers, prison warders; human resource managers in government or private industry, guidance and counseling lecturers in National Teachers Colleges and other tertiary institutions; those working with special needs groups such as refugees, street children, the bereaved, and victims of rape, defilement, dismemberment, unwanted pregnancy or AIDS.

Option 2: Candidates must be graduates in psychology (3:1:1 or 3:2:2) who wish to specialize in psychotherapy, who possess demonstrated maturity and well-developed people skills.

- b) Candidates who qualify during the initial screening will be invited to an oral interview before final acceptance into the programme.

Programme Structure

Duration

The programme is two years of intensive full-time study. Lectures, independent inquiry, and practical work will comprise the first four semesters and the recess term of the second year will be dedicated to completion of a dissertation. Approval of the dissertation topic must be procured by the end of the first year of full-time study.

The programme will utilize several relevant instructional techniques, including lectures, role play, audio and/or video taping, and practical. Two supervised counseling practical must be successfully completed. The course includes four semesters of full-time study plus a recess term for research. Original research must be presented in the form of a dissertation.

MASTER OF ORGANISATIONAL PSYCHOLOGY (MOGP)

Objectives

The programme is designed to help participants acquire:

- Theoretical bases for individual assessment, development of the individual, change management, and performance management and control
- Practical skills necessary for professional efficacy which include:
 - Testing selection, interviewing, appraising
 - Job, task, and role analysis
 - Job evaluation
 - Developing the individual through counseling, assertiveness and social skills training
 - Designing and implementing Training programmes
 - Intervening in organizational processes and structures
 - Team building
 - Performance management and control.

Duration

The programme lasts three semesters of intensive evening study in addition to a fourth semester devoted to research and writing of a formal dissertation.
