POSTGRADUATE PROGRAMMES

POSTGRADUATE DIPLOMA IN COUNSELLING (GPGC)

This programme lasts one academic year or two semesters.

Objectives

The programme of study is intended for honours graduates who are presently involved in counseling and the helping professions. The programme is designed to provide opportunities for participants to acquire:

- (a) Theoretical bases for psychotherapy and the relationship between values and theory development.
- (b) Understanding of human function and dysfunction within society.
- (c) practical skills necessary for professional efficacy which include:
 - (i) Creating an emphatic environment to facilitate the counselee's hope for positive personal change.
 - (ii) Initiating therapeutic interaction between the counselee and counselor.

- (ii) Developing the counselee's coping skills and ability to maintain positive relationships within society.
- (iii) Liaising with counselee's family members and interpersonal network to help them set realistic life goals.
- (d) Positive attitudes requisite for a counseling professional.
- (a) Ability to facilitate the development of appropriate helping skills among non-counseling colleagues within institutions and organizations.
- (b) Training in self-evaluation and continuous knowledge acquisition to enable life-long professional development.

General Regulations

MASTER OF SCIENCE IN CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGY (MSCP)

Objectives of the Programme

Acceptance into this programme assumes a background in theories of development, and personality as well as knowledge of behavioural disorders as they develop across the life-span and as they are manifested in various cultural and social settings (including families, organizations, and the community), statistics and research methodology. Hence the theory and practice in clinical psychology is placed in the intellectual context of the general field of psychology and other social, behavioral, and science disciplines.

The programme is designed to provide opportunities for the participants to acquire:

- a) The background and knowledge to do assessment and diagnosis of psychological disorders and problems.
- b) The foundations for the practice of

psychotherapy to use in individual and group therapy applying both standard and brief solution focused approaches to meet the needs of one's clients or patients. Therapists work through awareness of the values and ethics of such treatment,

- c) The practical techniques and client understanding, empathy, and unconditional positive regard which skills include:
 - i) Developing a client therapist rapport that facilitates openness and confidentiality,
 - ii) Sensitivity to client defenses and resistances developed to protect the client from under stress and withdrawal,
 - iii) Freeing the client's personal strength and coping skills so as to develop and maintain positive
